Mellor Archaeological Trust continues to be busy as we move into the last six months of our "Revealing Oldknow's Legacy", Heritage Lottery Funded. project. The next important stages are the landscaping Mellor Mill and at the conservation and consolidation of the remains. This will be followed by the erection of interpretation boards and displays. Access to the digital information is via the project website: http://oldknows.com/ where it is possible to book onto events and download the "Oldknow's Audio Tour and Quest" App from the App Store and Google Play. The App includes some impressive Augmented Reality images, Virtual Reality images and Audio clips from experts.

Why not come down and visit us at Mellor Mill? We are there each Saturday and Sunday between 10am and 4pm and love to receive visitors. There is so much more to see now that the dig has been painstakingly by our 'dig' cleaned up volunteers. The huge size of the mill is now clear to see as vou take in the view down the length of the drive shaft run stretching from the **Steam Engine House to the** Wellington wheel pit. It is now difficult to recall how the site looked some six vears ago as we took on the task of clearing the Wellington wheel pit.

As all that goes on we are also just entering Year 2 of European the Funded **STORM (Safeguarding Cultural** Heritage through Technical and Organisational Resources Management) project. The UK project team has started to collect historical and current weather data that will inform predictions of weather patterns. The major risks, through climate change, to the cultural

heritage on the Mellor sites of Mellor Hill Top, Shaw Cairn and Mellor Mill have been identified and work on mitigation strategies begun. There is strong collaboration with the other European sites of Ephesus in Turkey, Rethymno in Crete, Troia in Portugal and Diocletian Baths in Italy.
